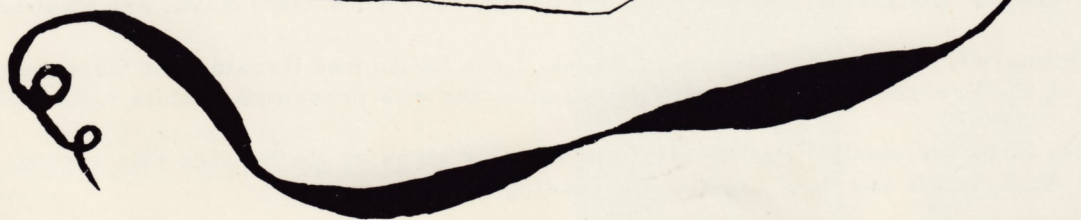
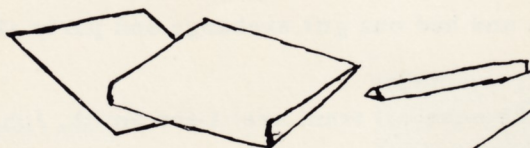
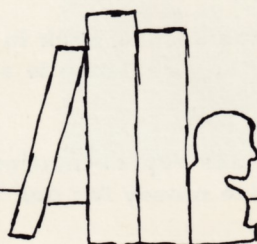
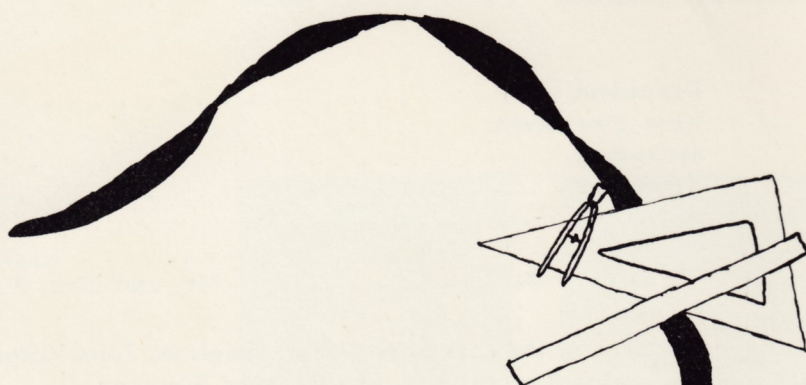
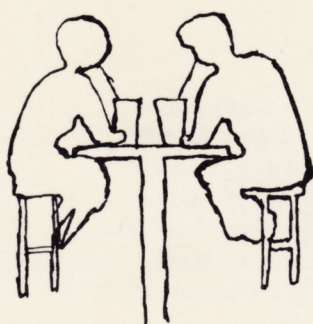
"Little Miss Somebody" was the name of the play given by the Seniors this spring, with Ida Belle Kirkpatrick and Paul Long as the leading characters.

The Seniors and Juniors are planning to take a trip to Carlsbad, New Mexico, after school is out.

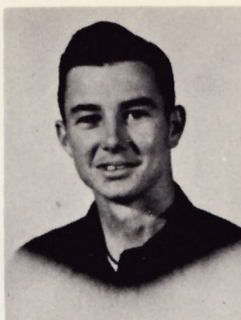

Out of 246 entries in the Greater Enid Contest, Jack Rickabaugh received \$25.00 for winning first place.

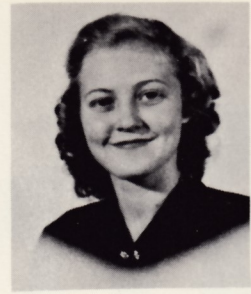

Our club accounted for half of the Champion Northwest Oklahoma Meat Identification Team of Garfield County. In Boys Judging, Louis Janzen won first, Carl Hays, second, and Lendoll Bagshaw. On the girls judging team, Gerry Toews won first place, and Doris Lee Seapy.

We had a good showing at the State 4-H Round-up with Carl Hays and Louis Janzen giving their champion team demonstration. Gene Rickabaugh was Garfield County's representative for Boys Individual Demonstration and Health Contest. Lendoll Bagshaw was the high individual of the Oklahoma Champion Garfield County Rifle Team. Doris Seapy had the Champion Timely Topic and Gerry Toews, the Dress Revue Winner.

Gerry Toews received medals for her gardening, clothing, and home improvement projects and because of her all-around 4-H work she received a \$25 Government Bond. At the first County Council meeting, Gerry Toews was elected the County Song Leader.

Kremlin also caught a big share of the honors at the County Fair. Tommy Joe Devery, Mickey Zaloudek, Rita Ruth, Lonnie Ruth, and Dean Ruth all won prizes in the County Fair on their calves. Jack Zaloudek won prizes on his sheep in the Kansas State Fair and in the County Fair.

Kremlin won the trophy for the first place club booth at the fair. In the judging contest, Rene Toews, Gerry Toews, Doris Lee Seapy, Sandra Sanders, Celia Selix, Edna Sanders, and Patsy Hays placed at the top of the list. Carl Hays placed first in crop judging. Lonnie Ruth, Mickey Zaloudek, Jack Zaloudek, Dean Ruth, and Tommy Joe Devery all placed high on the list of livestock judgers. Dean Ruth won prizes on his two calves at the Kansas City Royal earlier this year.

At the Garfield County Poultry Show, Lendoll Bagshaw, Avis Dickman, Patsy Hays, Mickey Zaloudek, Jimmy Zaloudek, and Warren Johnson all won first and second prizes.

The total club enrollment is now over 50 members, and we have had complete meetings each month. Our 4-H newspaper, edited by Johnnie Regier, tells of the activities that we do.

Dress revue winners were Gerry Toews, Doris Lee Seapy, Dorothy Irene Rickabaugh, Rita Ruth, Sue Nehring, Patsy Hays, Avis Dickman, Celia Selix, and Sandra Sanders.

At the Annual Achievement Banquet, Kremlin was presented with the three main trophies, which were accepted by Carl Hays, Gerry Toews, and Dean Ruth. Donny Chelf and Tommy Joe Devery were presented medals for their gardening project. Gerry Toews led the singing at the banquet and Carl Hays and Gene Rickabaugh were on the reception committee.

In February, the Rural Rotatory Club, presented Carl Hays a trophy for his 4-H achievements.

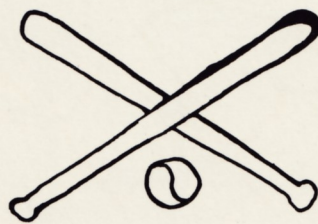
