Our candidate for Annual Queen was Mary Ann.

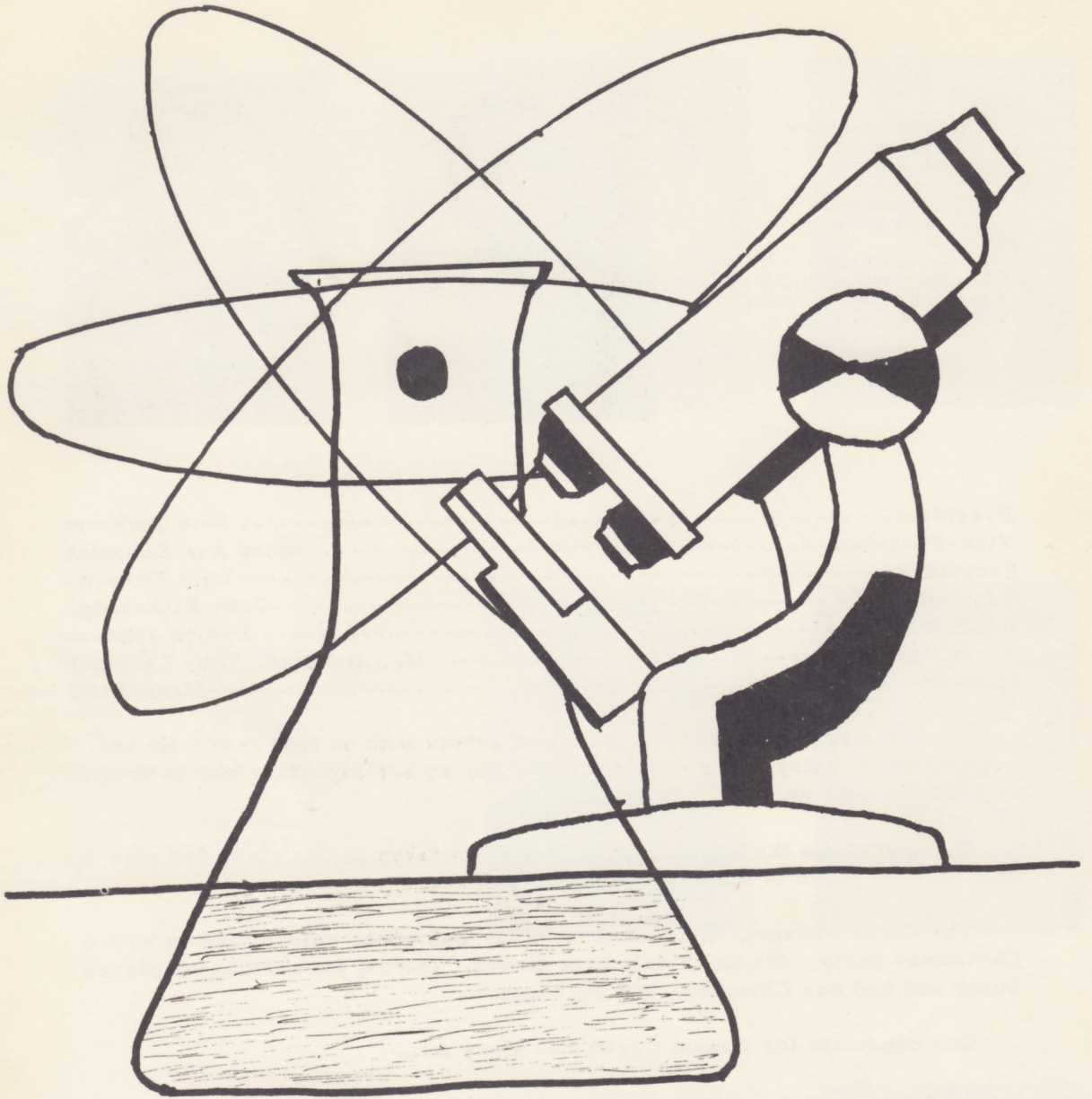
Avis was chosen Basketball Queen for 1950-'51. Her herald was Gene.

We gave a class play, "A Close Shave" under the direction of Mrs. Welty.

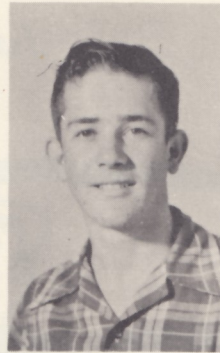
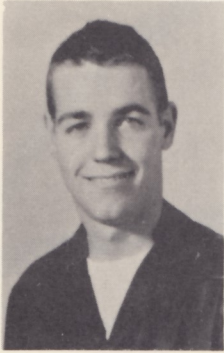

The Junior Play was held early this year just three weeks after the Senior Play. The name of the play was "Step On It, Stan." All members of the class participated.

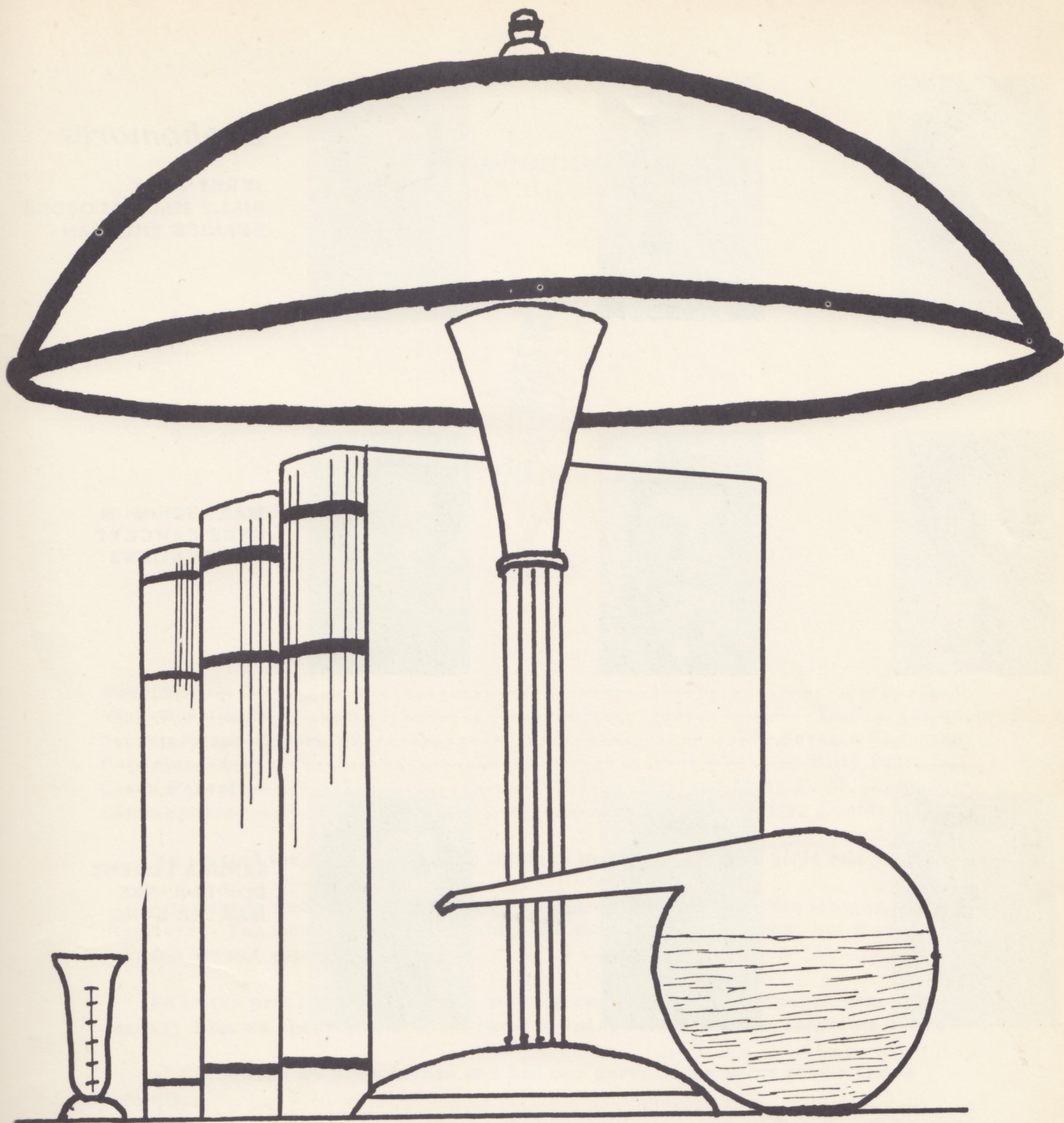
The night of the play Mrs. Baker had a party for the cast, the faculty and their families.

We had a donkey basketball game to raise money for our Annual Queen. Our candidate was Dorothy Miller.

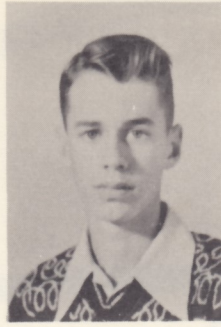

After three weeks of school Wanda Staggs moved to California leaving twelve members. You would think this would make the class voting even, but Wayne Johnson always votes with the girls.

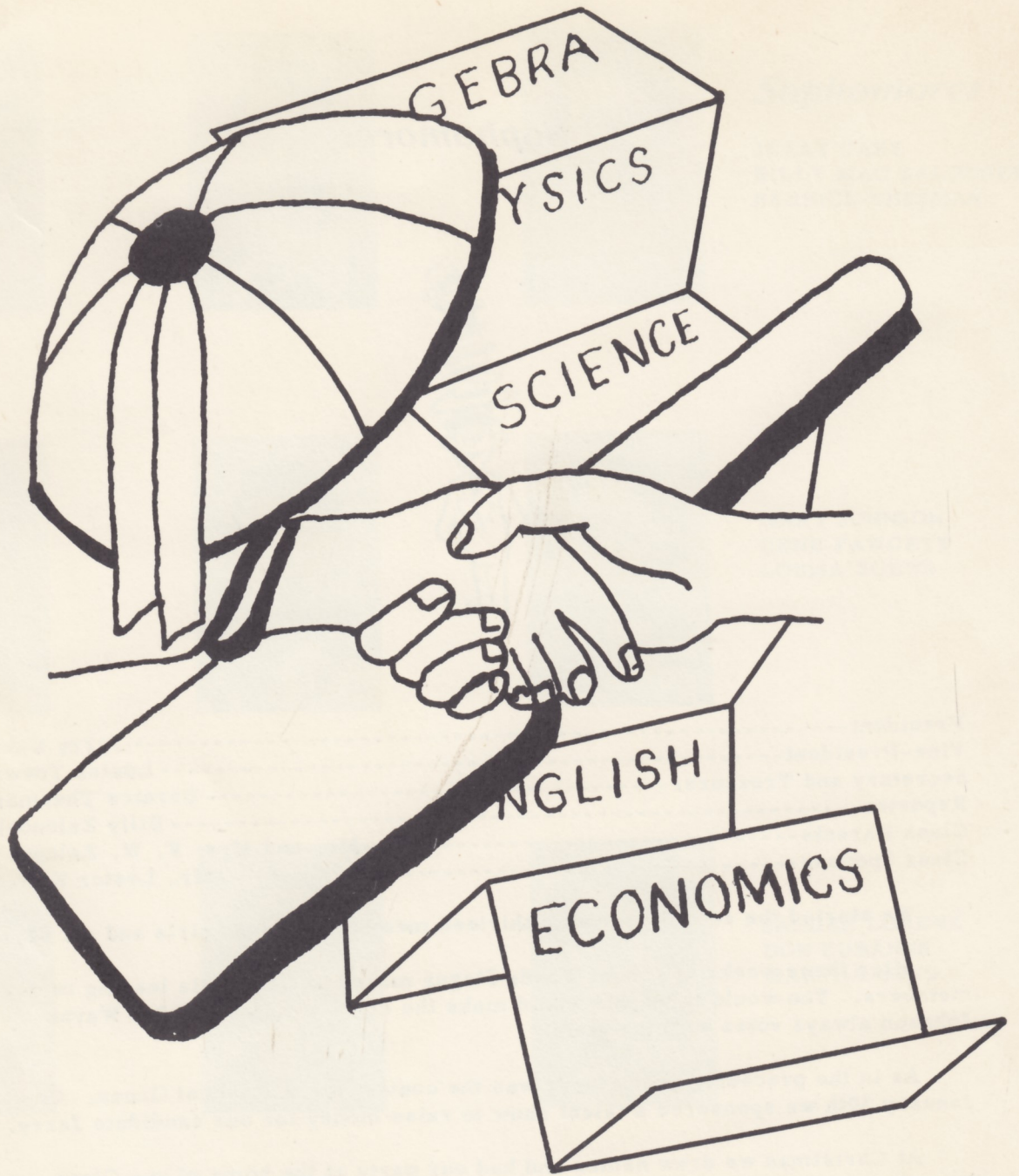
As in the preceding years there was the contest for the Annual Queen. On January 30th we sponsored a talent show to raise money for our candidate Jerry.

Our room gave a program for P. T. A. in October. We were asked to put the same program on at the Hillsdale School for their chapel.

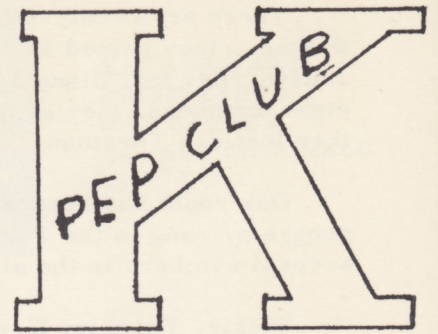
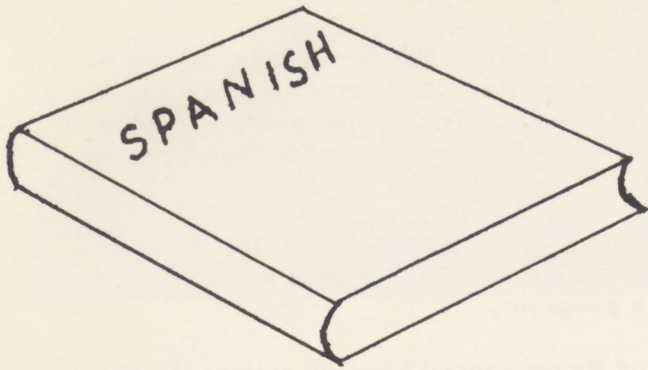
