In the Douglas tournament, they got to the finals only to be defeated by Longdale.

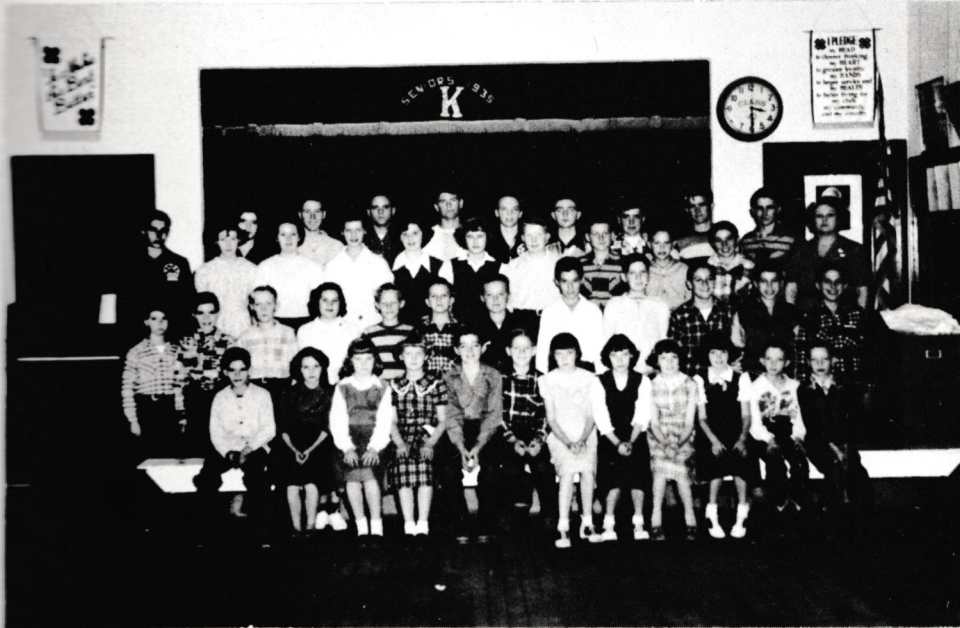
The Kremlin Tournament was their biggest achievement. They proved themselves as a ball team by winning first place. They downed Covington 29-12.
