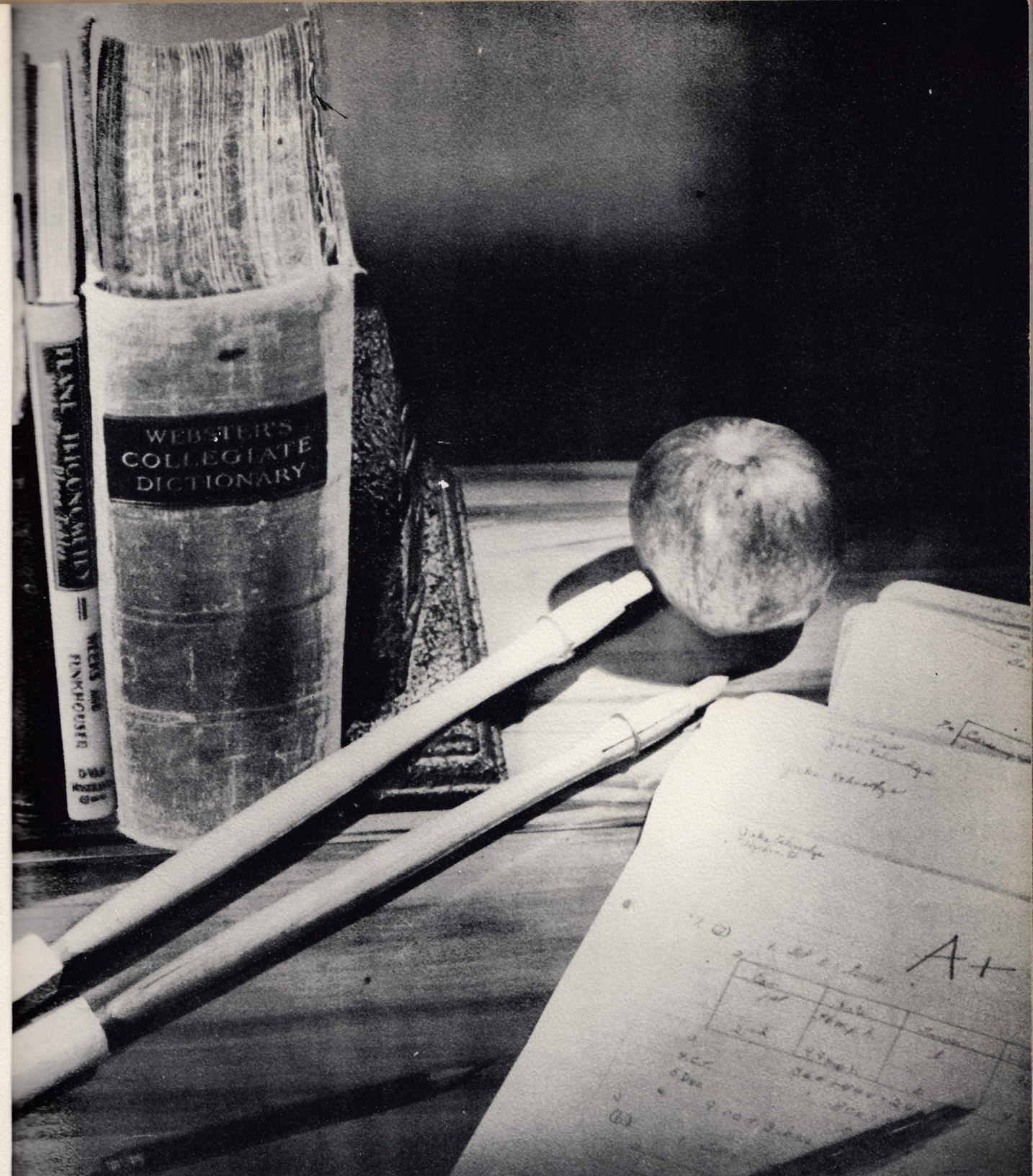

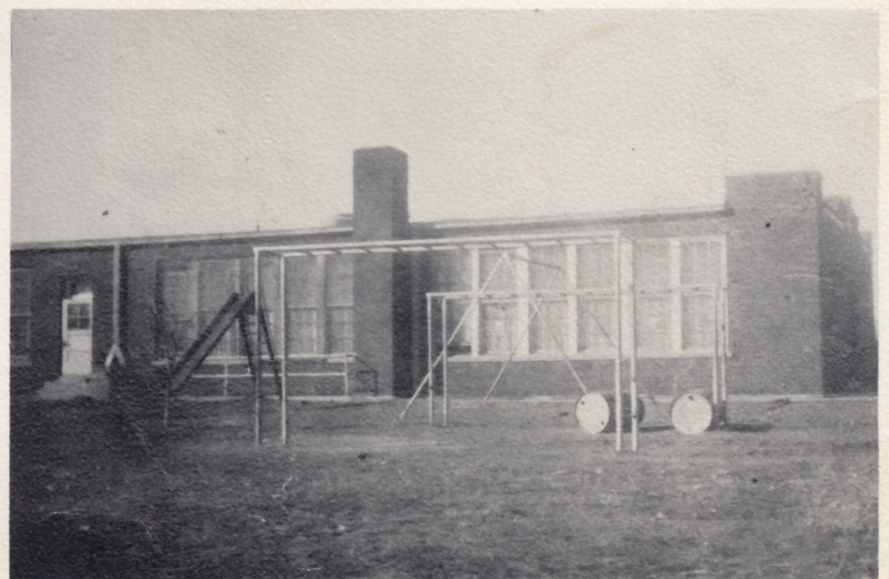
Dedication

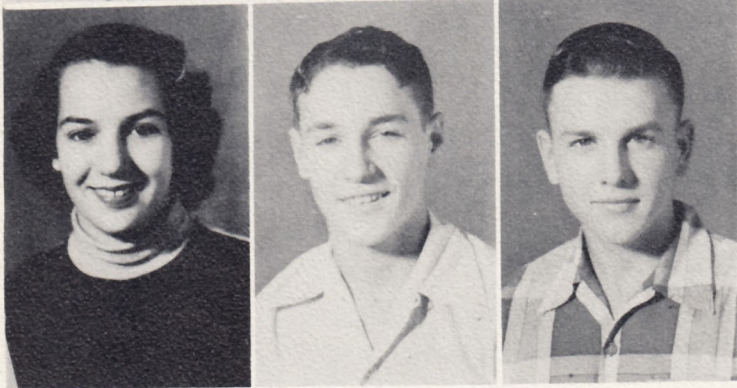
The Christmas party was held on December 17, at Laveta Frey's home. The class enjoyed a fine dinner, exchanged gifts, and went to the Esquire Theater.

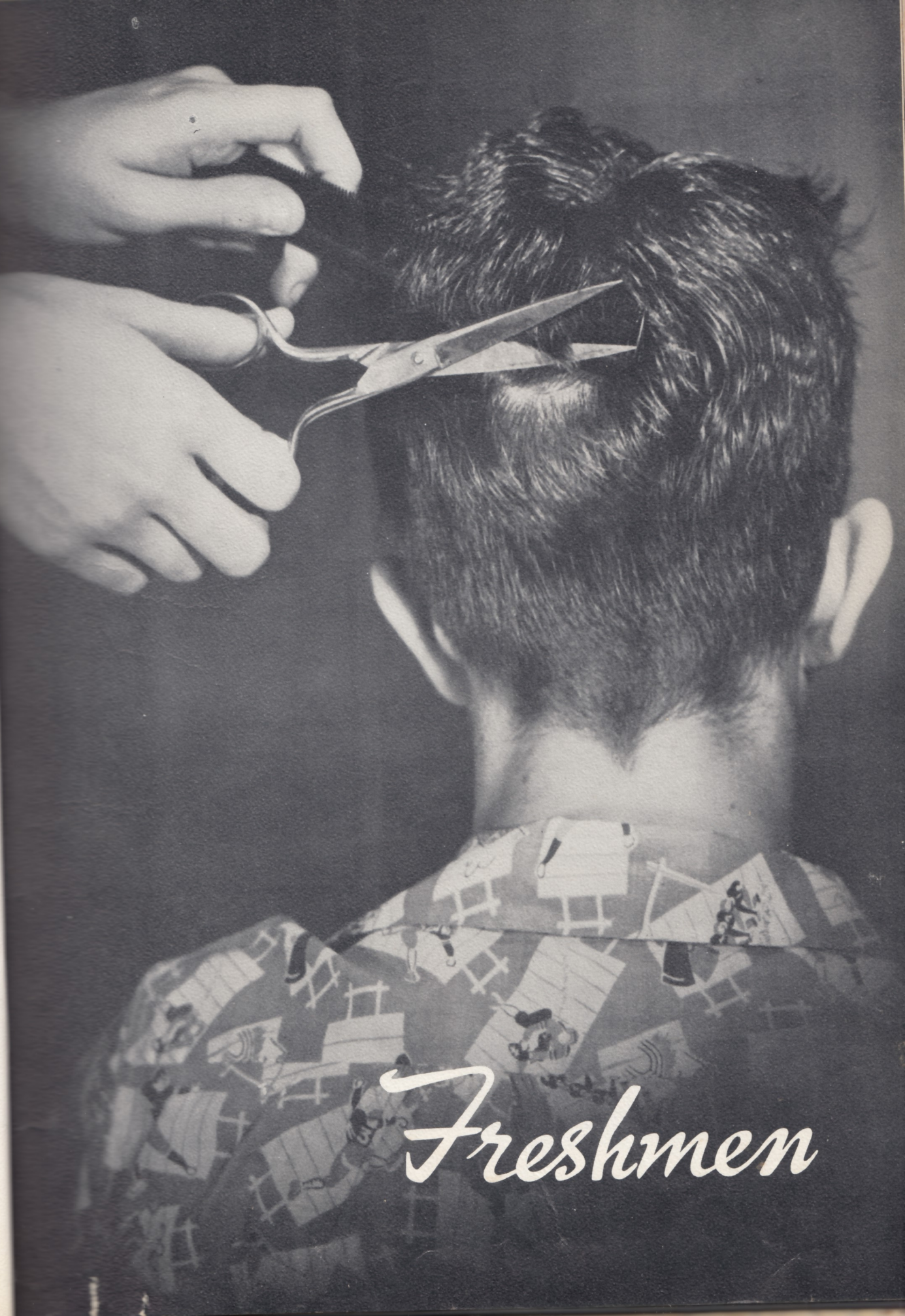
The Sophomore class, the largest in high school, started the year with twenty-four members. Mr. Lanning, the sponsor, formerly came from Michigan.

All the members participated in athletics and all the girls were members of the Glee Club and the Pep Club.

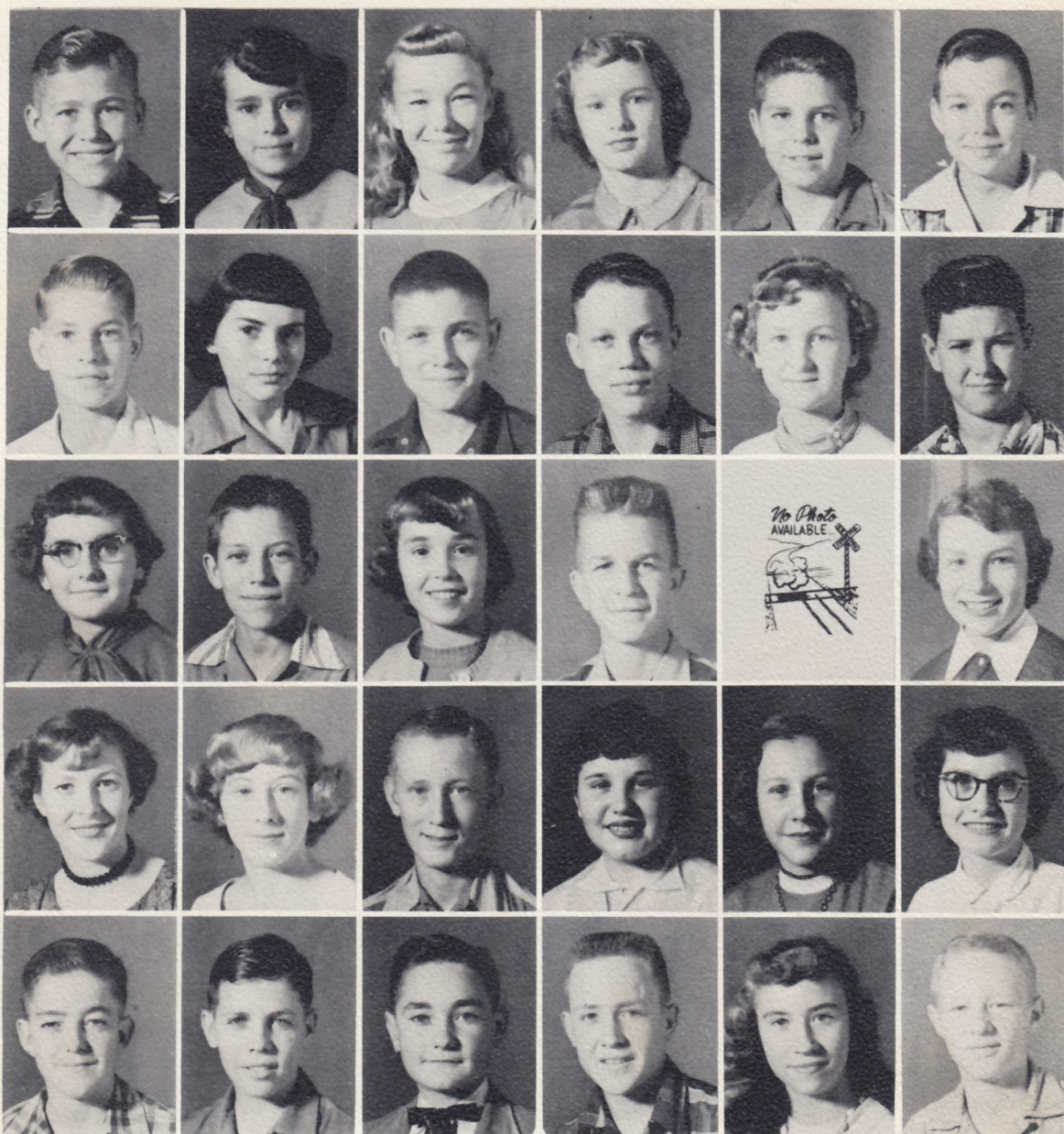

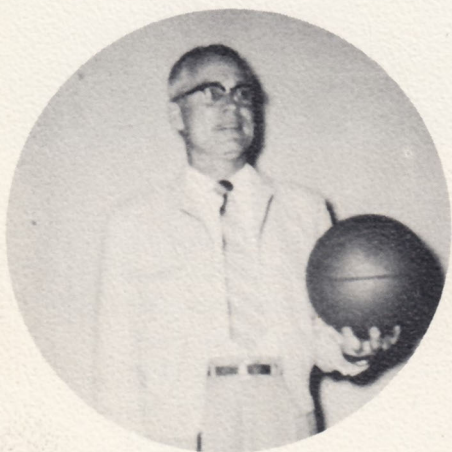

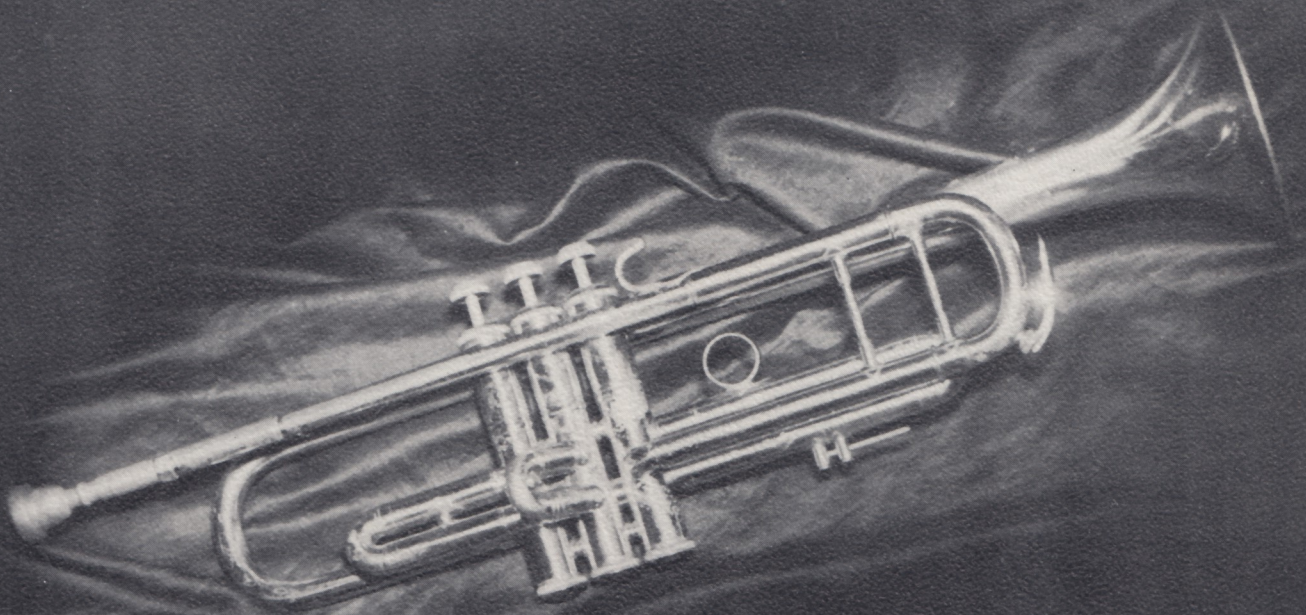

The grade boys' baseball team emerged victorious in three out of four games during the fall season. They played Hunter, Carrier, North Enid, and Douglas.

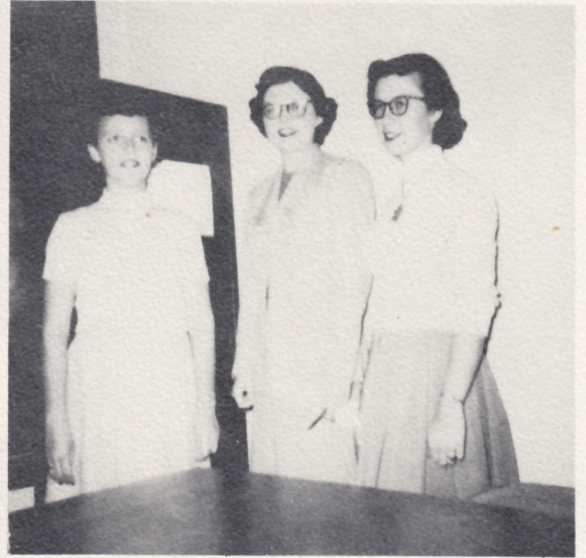
