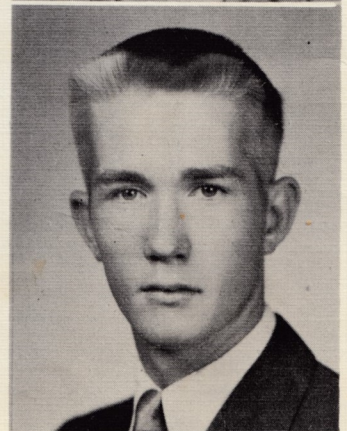
Sponsor

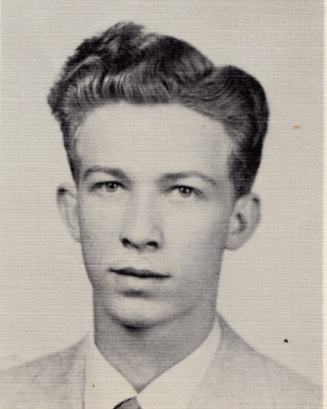
LOIS LONG

The Kremlin Broncos, under the guiding hand of Coach Stout, have finished one of the most successful seasons in the school's history.

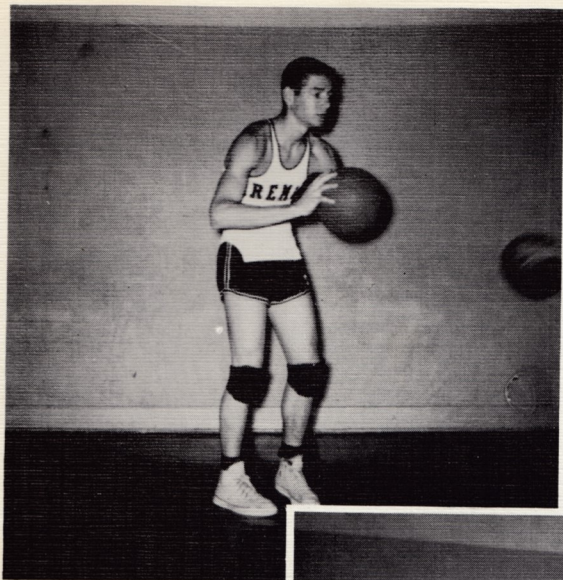
Losing only to Waukomis and Hillsdale, the Broncos finished tied for 2nd place in the Skelture Conference with Hillsdale.

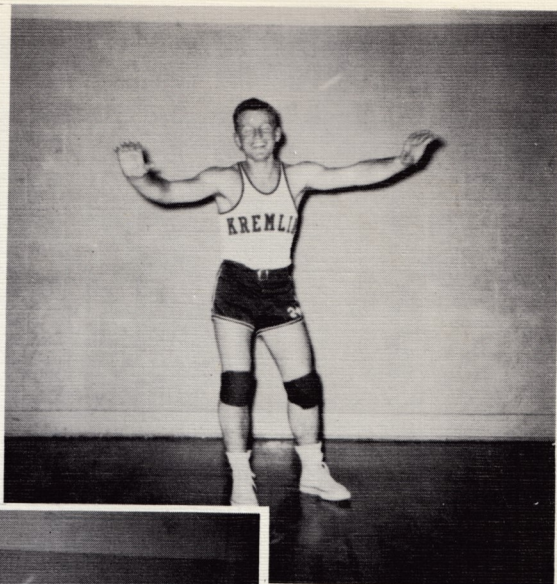
