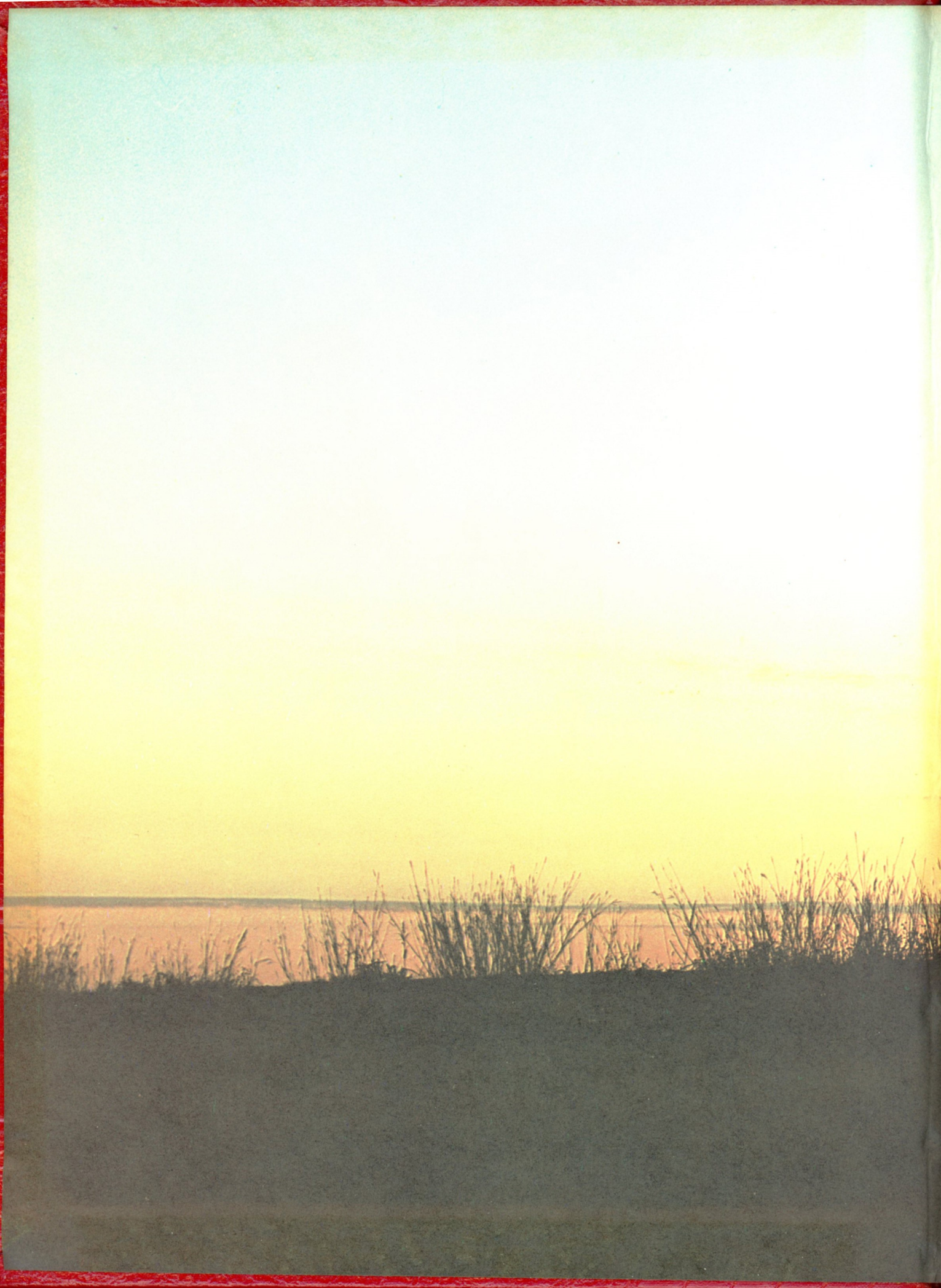


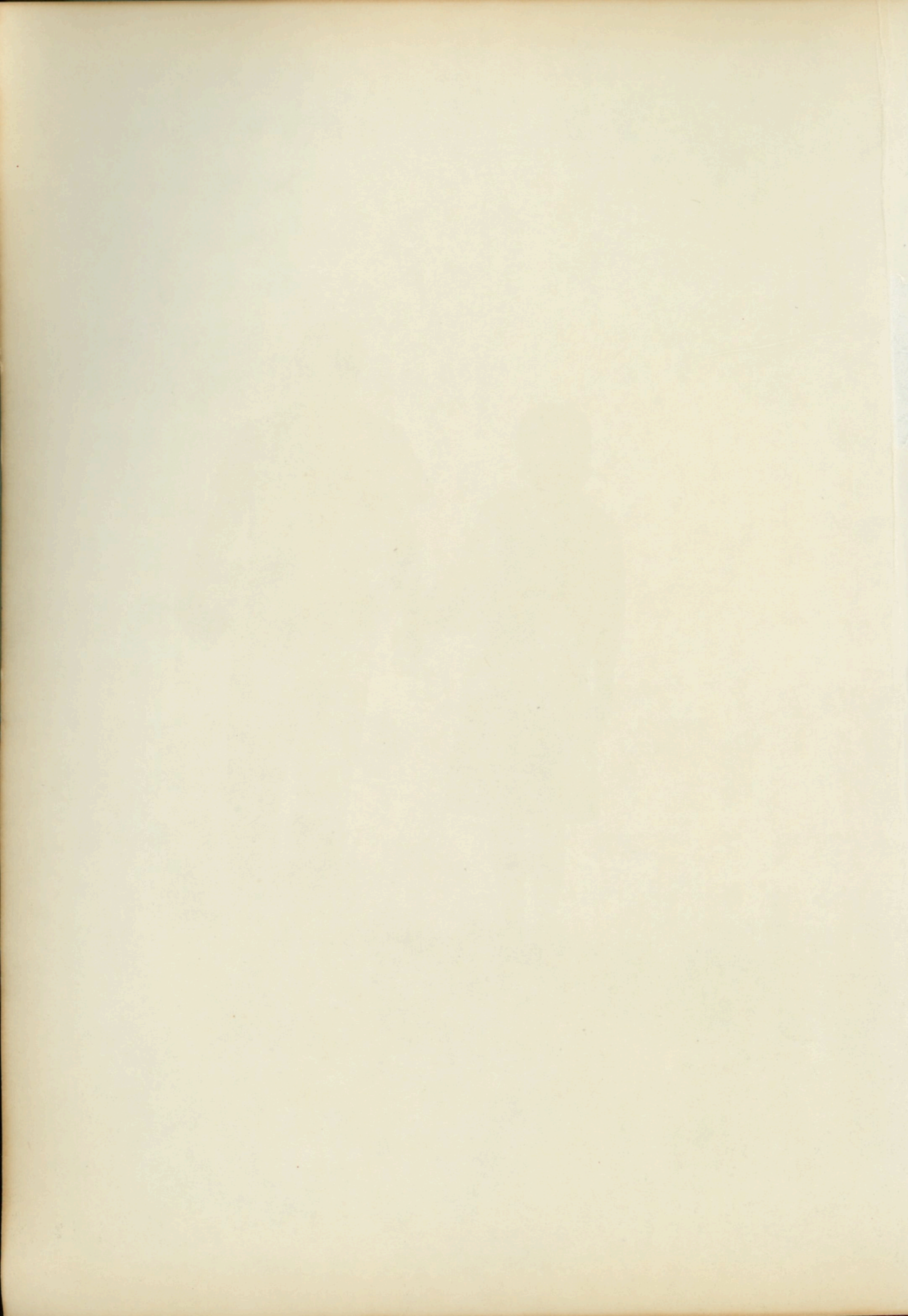

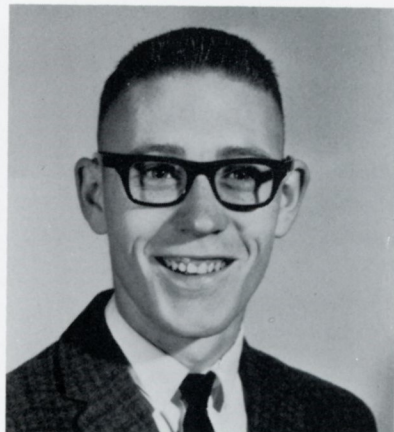
Editor's Message

Chapter 3 THE BEGINNINGS IN THE UNITED STATES OF GOVERNMENT

The roots of American government reach deep into the past. Our system of government did not suddenly spring into being as at the wave of some political magician's wand. Not was it pulled out of thin air by the

The Colonial Period

Our English, Dutch, Norwegian, French, Spanish, and other European settlers in parts of what was to become the United States. But it was the English who came in the largest numbers. And it was the English who came to control the thirteen colonies that stretched for 1,500 miles along the Atlantic seaboard.

These early pioneers who cleared the wilderness and fought off the Indians had to back out their own government in the New World. But they came here in search of greater freedom and they brought much of what

Founding Fathers at Philadelphia in the summer of 1787. Rather, it had developed through long centuries of experience, tradition, thought, and deed. We shall now review the high points of these beginnings.

They brought with them the concept of a government of the people. They had been working and experimenting in England for several centuries. They had learned that a government should be based on the consent of the governed. They had learned that a government should be limited in its powers. They had learned that a government should be responsible to the people.

(1) *The Two Concepts of Limited Government and Civil Liberties.* They brought with them, too, the twin ideas of limited government and civil liberties. That is, that government is limited in what it may do, and, especially, that it is limited in the sense

of which are to be found today — country, through jury, sheriff, constable, and justice of the peace, for example. England long before the first Englishman ever heard of America.

(2) *The Twin Concepts of Limited Government and Civil Liberties.* They brought with them, too, the twin ideas of limited government and civil liberties. That is, that government is limited in what it may do, and, especially, that it is limited in the sense

that each man has certain rights that government cannot injure or take away. These great principles of freedom were proclaimed in such historic English documents as the Magna Carta in 1215, the Petition of Right in 1628, and the Bill of Rights and the Act of Toleration of 1689.

(3) *The Concept of Representative Government.* A third vitally important concept brought to America in English ships was that of representative government. For centuries there had been developing in England the



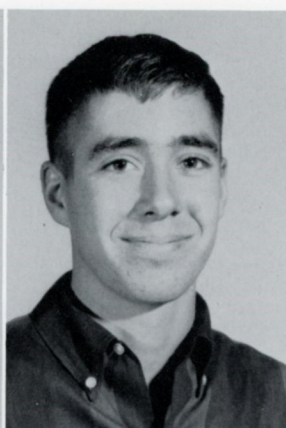
