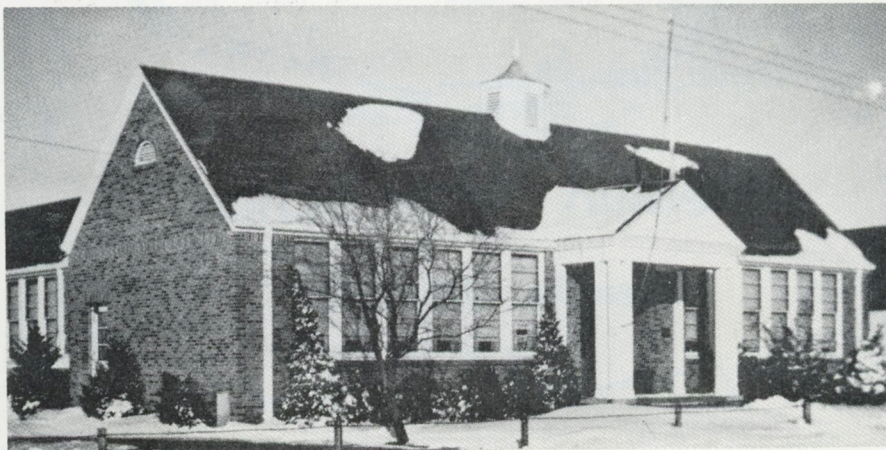

Editor's Message

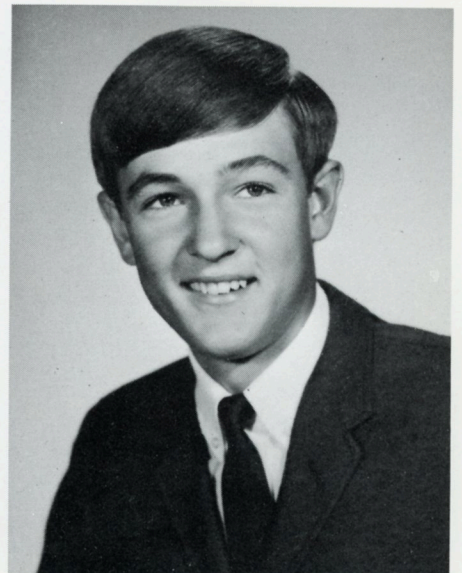


Superintendent's Message

This school year has marked a big change in school structure. The pupils have come together from new areas. This yearbook is an attempt to record that first year of the union of Hillsdale and Kremlin.

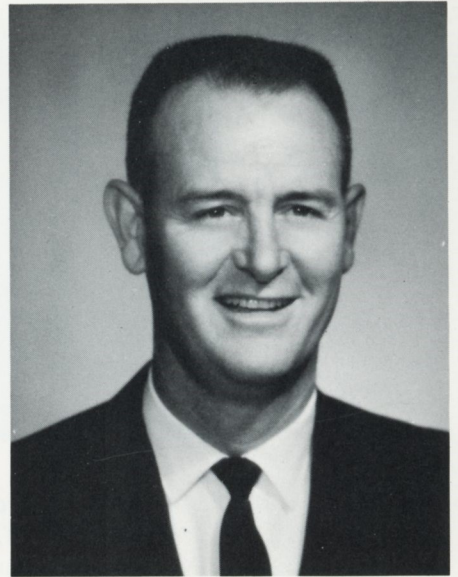

Kremlin won the right to enter the state playoffs by a coin toss between the three teams. The Broncs met Jet-Nash in the playoffs and were defeated 31 to 14 after having Jet-Nash down 14 to 0 at halftime.

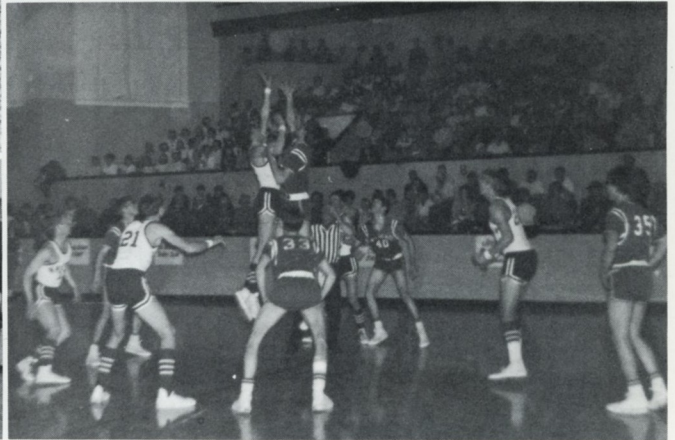

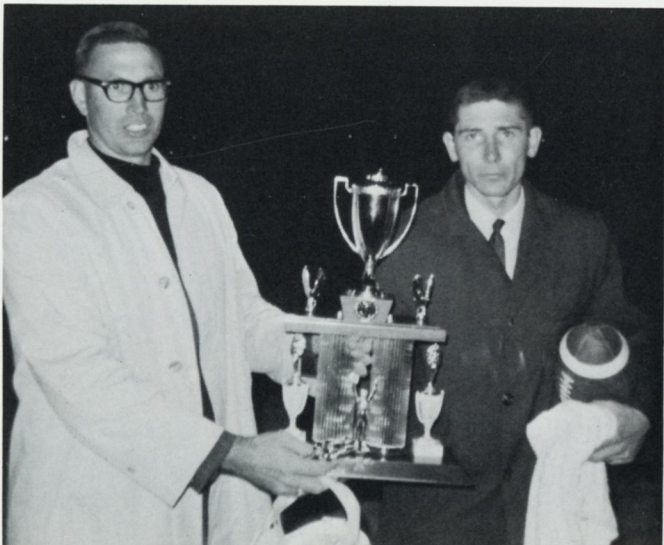

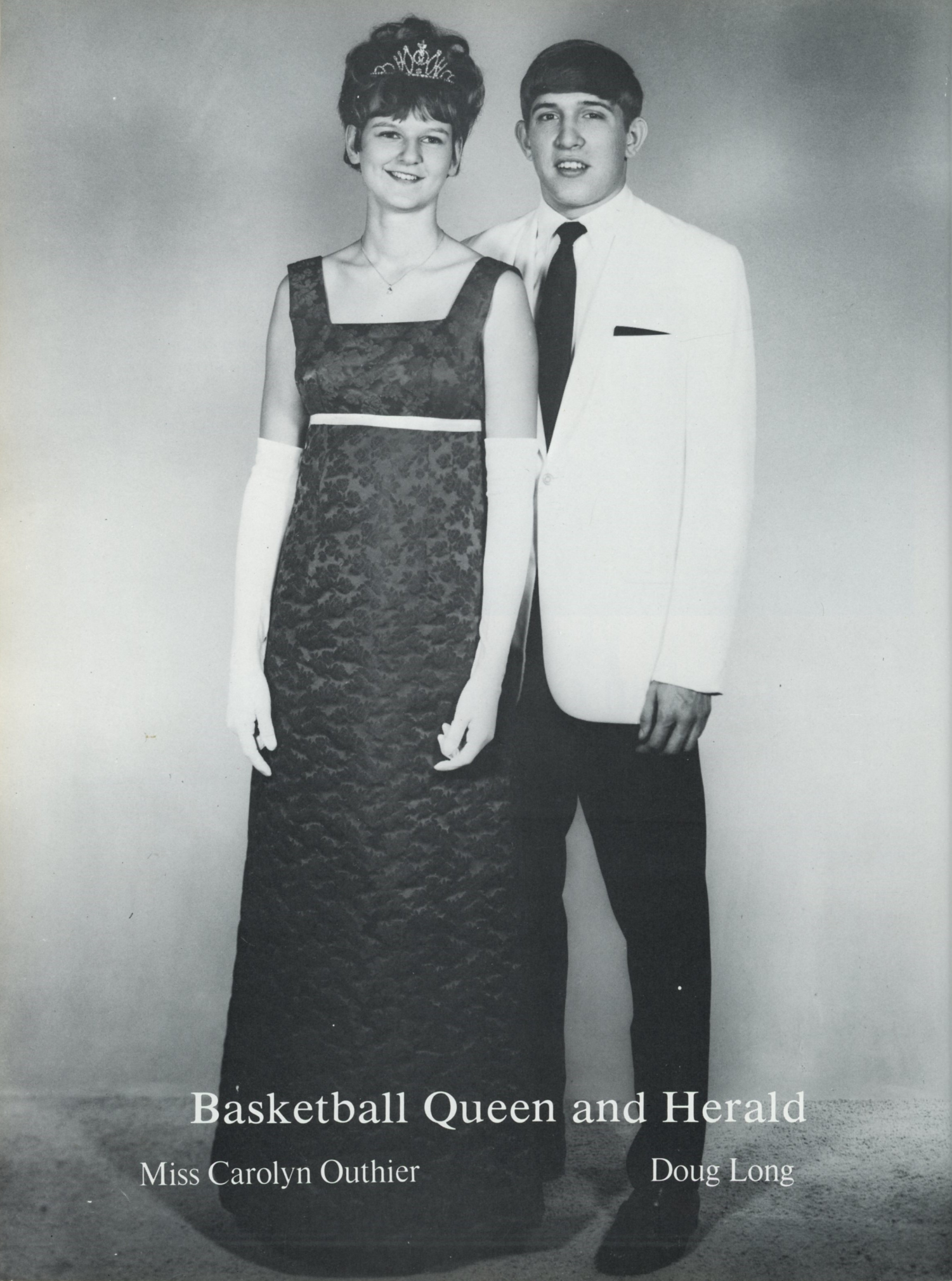
The crowning of the Football Queen took place during half-time ceremonies of the Kremlin-Covington game on Friday, October 25.

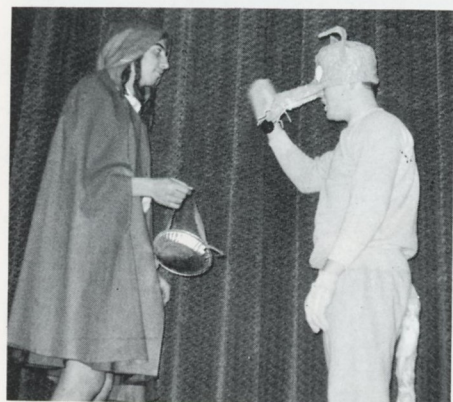

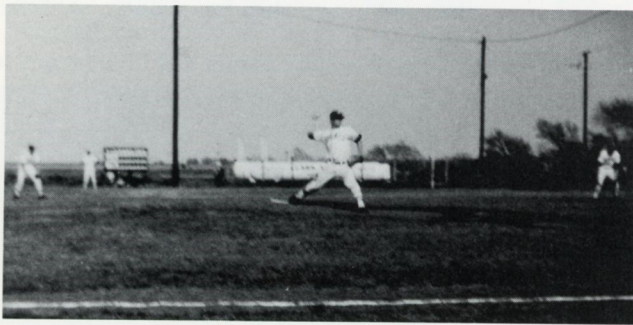


Athletics

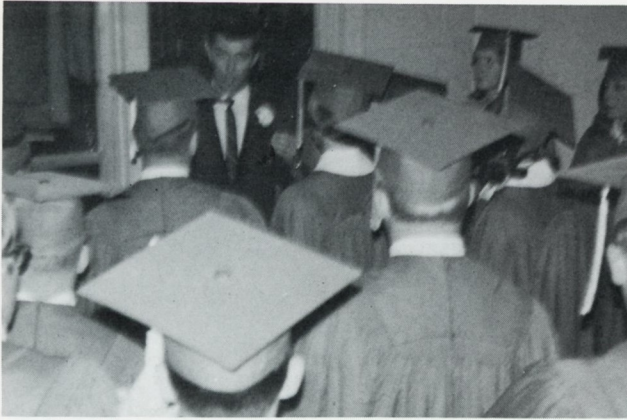


High School Graduation

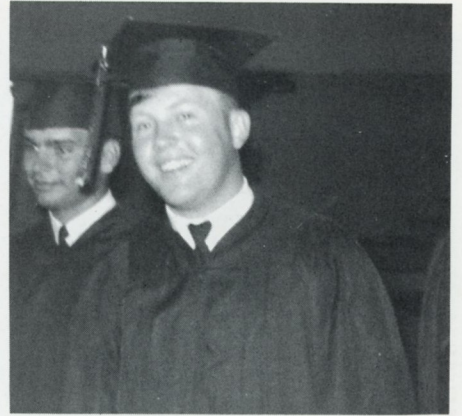

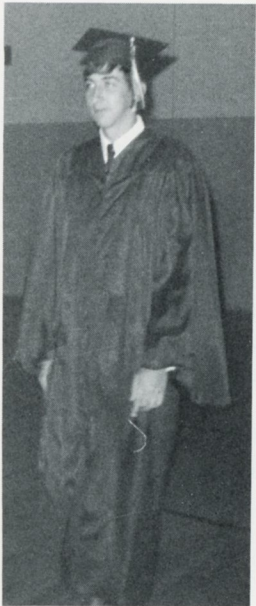




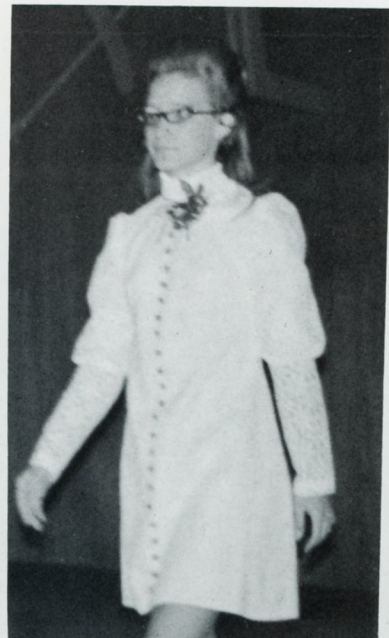
